Privacy

The Gramm-Leach-Bliley Act and related Federal Trade Commission (FTC) regulations, requires that Enrolled Agents and all other personal financial service providers disclose their privacy policies to clients in a written notice. Your Responsibilities

It is your responsibility to provide us with all the information necessary to complete your tax return. In that regard you agree to provide true, correct and complete information regarding your income and amounts claimed as tax deductions. You have maintained and will retain for 5 years all the documents to substantiate the items of income and expense claimed on your return. We will not audit or otherwise verify the information that you supply, however we may require clarification or additional information. We also suggest that you contact us immediately if you discover additional information that will lead to a change in your return, or if you receive any correspondence from the IRS, state or local taxing agencies. You are responsible for all taxes, penalties and interest resulting from disallowed deductions or the inclusion of additional income by the taxing authorities. However, in the event of a preparer error, you are responsible for additional tax due but we will stand behind our work and credit you for any penalty imposed.
